Responses to commonly asked questions:

- HVA EMS Education Center accepts the GI Bill for courses in the classroom only; cash, check and credit card are acceptable forms of payment for blended online courses.
- EHP offers relocation pay, if employed by the company, to those who qualify.
- Both EMT and Paramedic courses are offered via a blended online or traditional classroom style. All practical labs are conducted in Ann Arbor at this time.
- There are 32 hours of hospital and 48 hours of ambulance rotations.
- Students are required to take a required pre-requisite Anatomy & Physiology course, which can also be taken online through HVA EMS Education.
- All EMS students must pass the interview and physical and background checks to be hired with EHP.
- While obtaining an EMT license, students are encouraged to apply to work in our non-emergency, wheelchair van division.
